WOW! December has been a very busy month for Auxiliary activities. We appreciated the support for our craft fair

where funds generated help to support our programs. A special thanks to the SAL for hosting the toy drive on December 9th and to those who came for a great buffet breakfast along with a new unwrapped toy for military Eighty-nine toys were received and were transported to Camp Pendleton on Tuesday December 18th along with the final donation of food and other household items donated this year. Last year, 1,261 pounds of food were donated; this year total pounds of food donated was 1,320.57! Each year our donations of food increases, which we all should be very proud. While we did not meet our goal of 1,500 pounds this year, next year's collection will begin again in January and continue through mid-December. As we mentioned last month, our partner for donations of military families is Helping Hand Worldwide who distributes our donations at south Camp Pendleton on the 1st, 3rd, and 5th Tuesday each month. Camp Pendleton north is served on the 2nd and 4th Tuesdays each month. Linda Milford and I attended a class in order to obtain a year's pass to go on to the base which included a background check. We were notified we can pick up our pass before January 13.

On Tuesday, December 18, I attended the distribution of food and toys on the base at the Blinder Memorial Chapel building in order to see the operation in action. Two refrigerated trucks arrived on scene and many volunteers were present to unload the donations from Trader Joe's, Albertsons, organic farm produce, dozens and dozens of eggs from a partnering egg ranch, desserts, assorted breads, and even floral donations and our donations of food and toys. Each volunteer present worked their areas to inspect the eggs for cracks which were eliminated, and all other donations for quality prior to extending the invitation for families to come in and load up on items for home. I met many of the volunteers and was introduced as being a member of our Unit and Post 149, a new partner of the organization, and as the "person who brought all the donated toys!" families expressed their appreciation for our donations and it was fun watching them choose that perfect toy and their needed food items.

Linda Milford, Chair of VA&R and Community Relations recently presented another check in the amount of \$200 to the Aspire Center to support their Residential Rehabilitation Treatment Program (RRTP). The donation is used to support the \$1.00 coffee cards provided to patients as an incentive to reach their specific goals and the coffee cards helps to provide encouragement to undertake these difficult activities. The coffee cards may be used at the California Bean Company. In addition to the \$200 presented to the Aspire Center, Linda also presented hygiene bags and women's clothing which was very much appreciated as many of their patients arrive with little resources.

Children's Christmas Party was a success again this year. Over 30 children arrived to see Santa (Christopher Marszalek) and his helpers who presented gifts to all the children and many faces expressed happiness with their gifts. Special thanks to the SAL group who provided a lunch of hot dogs, burgers, mac-n-cheese, pasta salad and drinks. The children also participated in frosting their own cookies much to their delight and creativity! On Friday, December 21, a Christmas Party for the Head Start Preschool on Hickory and Washington were treated to a visit by Santa along with toys donated for the event by donations from our Auxiliary members Ann Marie Brown, Diana Young, and Irene Clingman. Donated items included backpacks, Beanie Babies, teddy bears, various toy vehicles, small dolls, and other items as well as candy canes. The preschool also received donations from Toys for Tots for the children. Our donations were presented to the Director, Jacquelin Marrou, who along with her staff members were dedicated to wrapping all the toys for the children and were Santa's helpers. Several Auxiliary members attended the party.
