As you may, or may not have heard, S.B. 504 was signed by the President and it opened up the eligibility dates for veterans. As of

now, any active duty, reserve, National Guard, or honorably discharged veteran who served after December 7, 1941 is eligible to join The American Legion.

Also, at the American Legion Auxiliary national convention this year, a vote was taken to change 'wife' to 'spouse'. This opens the ALA to the male spouses of female veterans.

If you know of someone who is now eligible to join, please have them contact the Post Adjutant and we can take care of them.
