As July ends and August begins, we find ourselves dealing with mandates and lockdowns again. We are doing our best to keep the Post open for you, but have

met with minor resistance from some members along the way. We fully understand if you are not comfortable coming to the Post, then you should wait until you are. We also understand there are members who still wish to attend meetings or socialize with friends. Our job to find a happy medium that accommodates all members while still following the 'Big 4" sanitary guidelines set by the County.

Working in conjunction with the City of Escondido, the San Diego County Supervisors, and the San Diego County Health Department, we were able to get a determination that your American Legion Post is not considered a public restaurant or bar. That lifts a lot, but not all restrictions. It allows us to continue to care for our veterans and provide you necessary services to include food service.

We were under the impression we did not have a restaurant license, but after going through our records, we found that we actually had one for over seven years. This allows us to provide more than Friday dinners and Sunday breakfasts. All the while, keeping the clubroom open to you. Currently, we are working a plan to have

food service seven days a week with a limited menu and schedule.

Another thing we could use your help with is our need for volunteers. We are required to audit the funds of the Post annually and need three volunteers for this. We also need some volunteers for the newly reconstituted Clubroom Committee. Keith Richter is chairing the committee and will be discussing renovations in a separate article of this newsletter.

Finally, I would like to give a special thank you to Escondido Mayor, Paul McNamara, for the new street signs that will be installed on both north and southbound Broadway. These three-foot by three-foot signs will not be easy to miss and allows for more of the community to know where we are. The mayor and I had a great conversation and we are lining up more great things for the Post and our local community.
