Joseph's story occupies more space in the book of Genesis than the stories of Adam, Noah, Abraham, Isaac, or his own father, Jacob. He was the son of Jacob's true love, Rachel, and his own brothers hated him.

Their antagonism and hostility toward him, fueled by envy, began to grow, and ultimately they decided they wanted to kill Joseph. But they changed their minds when a group of Midianite slave traders passed by. So they sold Joseph to them for 20 pieces of silver. Then the Midianites brought Joseph to Egypt.

Potiphar, the man who purchased Joseph, was very powerful, the head of Pharaoh's palace guard. Joseph was so responsible, so hardworking, and so full of integrity that Potiphar gave him more and more responsibilities. Ultimately, he put Joseph in charge of his entire estate.

However, Potiphar's wife was determined to sleep with Joseph, who kept refusing her. She was far from subtle about it, and one day when the other servants had left the house, she grabbed Joseph and pulled him down on the bed.

Joseph ran out of the house as fast as he could, but she

falsely accused him of rape. So Potiphar sent Joseph to prison.

How easily Joseph could have been discouraged. How easily he could have said to God, "Lord, I can't take this anymore. First, my brothers sell me into slavery, and then this woman tries to entice me. I resisted her, and then she lied about me! Now I'm in prison. This isn't fair!"

It wasn't fair. Yet the Bible never tells us that Joseph said anything to that effect. He could have felt like God had forgotten him, but the Bible gives us this very important detail: "The Lord was with Joseph" (Genesis 39:21).

The Lord was with Joseph as he sat there in that prison. And wherever you are today, the Lord will be with you, too.

Girls State 2021 - Our Girls State Delegates for 2021 have been chosen after conducting interviews via Zoom from each of five schools that are participating this year. Cathy Wathen and I interviewed each of the candidates who were selected to be

interviewed by their school's counselor. Considering the number of junior high school girls attending each of the five schools, it was an honor to be selected as one of the five candidates to be interviewed; each of the candidates are scholars who are enrolled in advanced placement classes. are members of the honor society, and perform outside volunteer community activities. Several of the delegates have formed their own clubs on campus and invite speakers to address topics of interest to their club members. It is such a rewarding experience to be a part of the Girls State Interviewing Committee and to meet with our student leaders of the future. Unfortunately, due to the pandemic, actual attendance for this year has been cancelled and will be conducted via Zoom as was last year. California has reserved 540 spaces for this year's program and during the Zoom sessions the girls will be divided into cities where a city mom and two counselors will be conducting the sessions with approximately 30 girls each. There will be sessions where everyone will be in attendance for discussions and each of the girls will be required to decide

and complete a project as well as writing a piece of legislation which will be presented. It is my pleasure to announce this year's delegates as follows: Emily Parvis - Escondido High School; Isabella Moreno - Escondido Charter High: Jasmin Bogarin Macedo - Orange Glen High; Marianne Sadik - San Pasqual High; Malaya Pojas - Valley Center High. It is my hope that towards the end of summer, and pending status of the pandemic, that we will be able to host a Boys/Girls State dinner at our Post where parents will also be invited and we can hear about their experiences. Helping Hand Worldwide is working every day to serve our community. Again, every Tuesday of each month a distribution is set up only to serve families from Camp Pendleton. On the 1st, 3rd, and 5th Tuesday the distribution takes place in Oceanside; on the 2nd and 4th Tuesday the parking areas of the San Clemente Mall are utilized as the distribution for the north Camp Pendleton area. On other days of the week this organization serves community members who are in need. Now is a really good time for all groups at Post 149 to pick up a few items for our food challenge as we address the needs of military families. If you belong to an organization that would like to hold a food drive for the military, I will be more than happy to work with your group. We accept all food items except products that need refrigeration and those that are expired and no glass items please. You may drop your items in the bin at the Post.
