Food Challenge for Military Families. On Tuesday, October 5th, I attended the military food distribution drive-through event with our food donations. The event was held at the Melba Bishop Recreation Center on River Road in Oceanside. From June 30

through October 4, we generated 229.06 pounds of food along with non-food items such as a wristwatch, stick vacuum, chafing dish set, baking dish with metal rack, a TV sound bar, diapers, and a stainless steel steamer pot. Final food donations thus far since January 2021 equals 1.339.24 pounds. For the last few years my hopes were that we would reach a goal of 1,500 pounds of food and we may meet that goal this year. Thanksgiving and Christmas will soon be here and at the present time our country is facing difficulties with transportation issues with ships sitting outside loading docks with no clear plans to move ahead and get ships unloaded and to move shipments to their shipping locations. While food is still available in many places, we may be facing a shortage of food, electronics, and toys for the holiday season. Let's make sure we meet the needs of our military families and veterans as we shop by picking up some items appropriate for holiday meals such as canned sweet potatoes, cranberry sauce, mashed potato packets, canned meat, canned vegetables, and bakery items to bake such as cake mixes, brownies, etc. Again, a special thank you to all who donate. We welcome large and small donations of food and/or cash donations. Reminder, no glass or outdated

items. Donations can be dropped in the food bin which is located at the Legion's Hall or in the bar area.

Donations from the Ladies In-Stitches Group of Madrid Manor – Once again, we have received very beautiful handmade items from this group. This time we received 3 baby blankets, 15 blankets of various sizes that included 14 crochet blankets and 1 fleece blanket; 5 burp cloths, 1 baby hat with matching scarf, 1 adult hat with matching scarf, 1 medium size hat, 16 adult size scarfs, and 3 beautiful quilts that were handmade and stitched. Our Post serves as the collection and distribution of these items on behalf of the ladies and I distribute the items according to their wishes.



The above stated items were delivered to Interfaith Community Services with the exception of the adult scarves which will be distributed to cancer patients via Ann Marie and Diane. Items from the ladies have been distributed to military families, veterans at the VA Hospital, an Escondido Preschool, and Interfaith

Community Services in the past. A special thanks to the In-Stitches Ladies who create beautiful items to help meet the needs of our community.

Poppy Committee – In September we received poppy supplies to create those beautiful red poppies to remind us of the sacrifices and blood shed during times of war. The poppy has been designated as one way we can serve our veterans. Each year, the month of May has been designated as National Poppy Month and we offer poppies and gratefully accept donations in which all funds donated goes back to the needs of veterans. There are no administrative fees except

each auxiliary post must pay for the materials to make the poppies. Our Poppy Committee is down to three people with Arlene Cox and myself making the poppies



and Barbara Burwell attaching the labels to the poppies. Last month, we generated 3,000 poppies and last Monday I received another supply to make an additional 4,000 poppies. This is only the beginning process and by the time we finish usually no later than mid-April, a total count of more than 60,000 + will have been made. Out auxiliary works together with Lois Cornish who manages this project for District 22. Lois works with military members at the WAVE Center in San Diego who actually make poppies as part of a rehabilitation program which helps to graduate these members back into the social and work life with many graduating into a paid position. For every poppy our committee makes, it generates **10 cents per poppy** with the funds being paid to those military members in the program. We actually worked with an individual suffering with PTSD who stated that making poppies helped to calm him down and that before he never thought creating craft items would have that beneficial effect on him. In the past, we had an actual committee of **10-15** members. Now we are looking for volunteers to join out committee. Once trained, you may work from home! It's really easy work to make and we are hoping that you might like to join our cause. Contact me with your desire to help! **iclingman@cox.net**, or see me at the post.
