Regardless of your current membership status, if you were a member in good standing in 2020 but did not renew your membership in 2021, and you renew your membership for 2022 you will have continuous years applied to your membership. This means if you were a continuous member for any number of years in 2020 and let your membership lapse, and you pay for 2022 membership year you would still have continuous membership time. If you wish to do this then there is a Member Data Form, we need to fill out to correct the years at National Headquarters. If you have questions or concerns, please let me or the Adjutant know.

The next program is the National Commander's Pin Incentive Program. Any legionnaire that helps three new veterans obtain membership in the American Legion, transfers do not count, will receive the "No Veteran Left Behind" membership excellence pin. Only a single pin will be awarded per individual and once the data is confirmed it will be mailed directly to the person who earned it.
