Does Thanksgiving have its roots and meaning in the Bible? Why is thankfulness important?

Thanksgiving toward God for his many blessings and perfect love manifested on us is a common theme in the Bible. For example, ancient Israel annually observed seven periods, known as the Feast (Holy) days, which centered on the three main harvests. One of the central themes of these days of "thanksgiving" is the acknowledgment that the Eternal makes possible our lives and that he is the source of our prosperity and wealth.

The actual word or its plural is found thirty times in the KJV, nine of which occur in the New Testament (2Corinthians 4:15, 9:11 - 12, Philippians 4:6, Colossians 2:7, 4:2, 1Timothy 4:3 - 4, Revelation 7:12). Of these nine occurrences, the apostle Paul refers to thanksgiving toward God eight times while John refers to it only once.

Food Challenge – On October 4,

I joined several representatives from Helping Hand Worldwide at the North County Food Bank in Vista to select food to be distributed to military families from

Camp Pendleton.

Our Auxiliary donated \$500 last month for the Food Challenge and I had the opportunity to assist in selecting foods utilizing some of that donation. For example, we were able to obtain many cases of food items such as peanut butter and black beans and other items at a cost of \$1.20 per case (12 units). We obtained lots of fruit of various



kinds and a special of that day was free green grapes. Oranges, avocados, cheese, granola, apples, bananas, potatoes, onions, etc., were added to our shopping carts which are then weighed on a scale for poundage, deducting items that were free. Our total expenditure for that purchase was \$67.60 and weighed in at almost 2,000 pounds. See pictures of the food obtained below. On October 18, a total of \$114.40 was utilized from our donation and that purchase was 2,242 pounds. Our goal this year was 1,500 pounds but at the present the total weight has exceeded that amount and now stands at almost 5,000 pounds. As you can see this cooperation with Helping Hand Worldwide allows us to provide much more food for hungry families.

The organization also works in conjunction with Albertsons, Trader Joe's, organic farm, an egg farm and flower farm. Helping Hand strives to provide fresh foods rather than canned items with the exception of items like peanut butter, tuna, beans etc.

Of course, our food donations at Post 149 will continue as usual again with no glass or outdated food. With the holiday season, it would be nice to donate holiday items such as pie fillings, cake mixes with frosting, brownies, as these are items are usually not provided as they are not considered necessity. THANKS!!


