This year I want to talk about these founding values with you.

One of the statements in the Preamble to the Constitution of the American Legion is "To foster perpetuate a one hundred percent Americanism." Americanism is an unfailing love of country, loyalty to its institutions and ideals, eagerness to defend it against all enemies, individual allegiance to the U.S. flag and a desire to secure the blessings of liberty to ourselves and our posterity. Ponder on this statement and ask yourself, "What does Americanism mean to me?" This question was asked and thought so important that our Founding Members placed it as an integral value and mission of the American Legion.

The Post supports Americanism by taking flags for proper disposal according to the U.S. Flag Code; sponsoring a Boy Scout Troop and an American Legion Baseball Team; supporting financially American Legion Boys State; holding an oratorical scholarship program (a Constitutional Speech

Contest). These are just a few of the functions our Post supports routinely.




